His primary areas of interest include Temporomandibular Disorders (TMD), Digital Occlusion (including DAHL Concept), and Sleep Medicine, and he regularly conducts courses on these topics for professionals worldwide.

Dr Greig D. TaylorClinical Lecturer/Specialist in Paediatric Dentistry at Newcastle University

Greig graduated with BDS(Hons) from the University of Glasgow in 2012. He was appointed as an academic clinical registrar at Newcastle University in 2016. He successfully passed his Membership in Paediatric Dentistry specialist clinical exams in 2019 before taking time out of clinical training in 2019 to undertake his PhD, funded by a prestigious personal NIHR Doctoral Research Fellowship. He defended his PhD, entitled the DECIDE study 'Dental ExtraCtion versus filling In aDult teeth in children: an economic evaluation,' in 2023. His main areas of research are molar-incisor hypomineralisation, reducing oral health inequalities and utilising economic methods to do so. He was an author on the most recent international best practice guideline for MIH and the RCS England guideline for managing poor prognosis first permanent molars. He is currently the Vice-President of the IADR Paediatric Oral Health Research Group and an associate editor of European Archives of Paediatric Dentistry journal.

Dr Amanda WillisClinical Reader and Consultant in Oral Medicine at Queen's University Belfast

Amanda Willis is a Clinical Reader and Consultant in Oral Medicine at Queen's University Belfast. On graduation with BDS in 2002 from Queen's University Belfast, Amanda spent several years in General Dental Practice and Community Dental Services before returning to work as a clinical teaching fellow in Restorative Dentistry/Oral Medicine. She completed specialty training in Oral Medicine at Bart's and the London and University College Hospital London and returned to Belfast to take up an academic position in the Centre for Dentistry at Queens University Belfast. Amanda's clinical and research interests include dental education, oral infection and mucosal disease.
