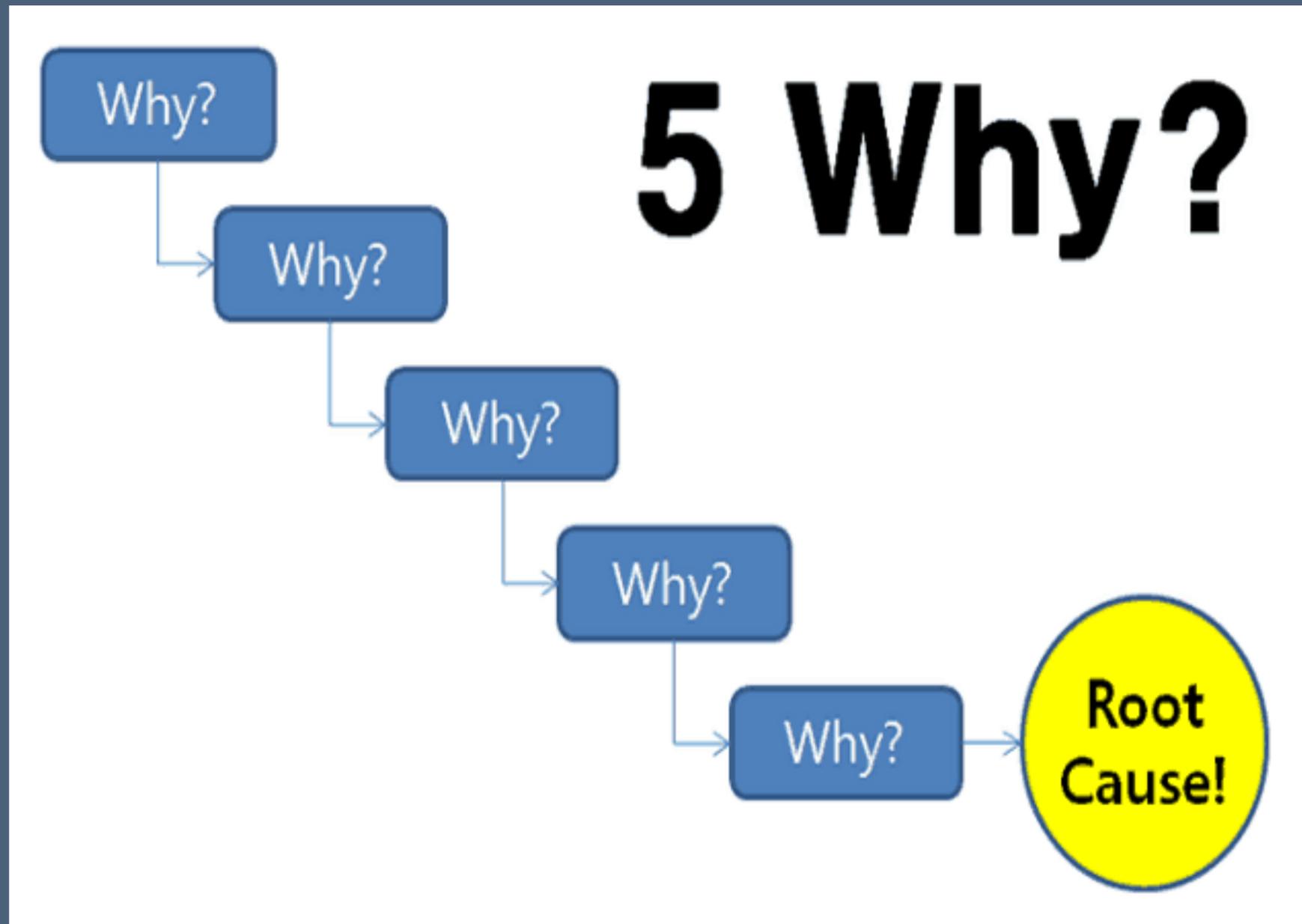
3. Risk Management

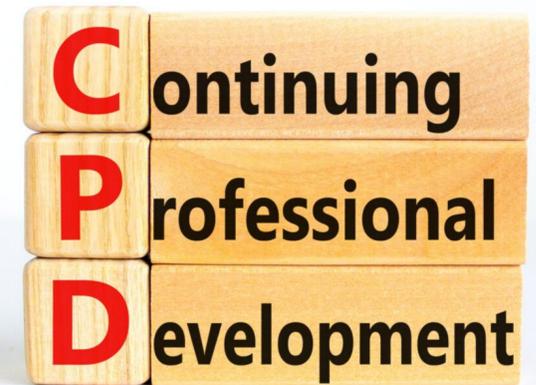

4. Education, Training & CPD

- Medical emergencies: at least ten hours per five-year CPD cycle with at least two hours per year
- Disinfection and decontamination: at least five hours per CPD cycle
- Radiography and radiation protection: at least five hours per CPD cycle
- Legal and ethical issues
- Complaints handling
- Oral cancer: early detection
- Safeguarding

6. Information Management

Principle	Explanation
Lawfulness, fairness and transparency	Processing of personal data should be lawful, fair and transparent
Purpose limitation	Personal data collected should only be utilised for the specified reason as to why it was initially collected
Data minimisation	The absolute minimum data should be collected and processed for the desired purpose
Accuracy	Personal data should be up to date. Inaccurate data should be erased or rectified without delay
Storage limitation	Personal data should only be stored for as long as needed. This will be dictated by the specified reason as to why said data was initially collected
Integrity and confidentiality	Processing to ensure security of personal data. This includes processing of data not consented for, loss or damage of personal data, and sharing of data to third parties
Accountability	A data 'controller' should be able to demonstrate compliance with all of the principles highlighted above
